

What is the origin of the word "quarantine"?

The word *quarantine* comes from *quarantena*, meaning "forty days", used in the <u>Venetian</u> language in the 14th and 15th centuries. The word is designated in the period during which all ships were required to be isolated before passengers and crew could go ashore during the <u>Black Death</u> plague. It was extended from 30 days.

But there was much prior usage of forty days from Biblical references.
