
## **The Marines Hymn**

The "Marines Hymn" is the official hymn of the United States Marine Corps. Authorized by the Commandant of the Marine Corps in 1929, it is the oldest official song in the United States Armed Forces.

Some lyrics were popular phrases before the song was written. The line "To the shores of Tripoli" refers to the First Barbary War, and specifically the Battle of Derne in 1805. After Lieutenant Presley O'Bannon and his Marines hoisted the American flag over the Old World for the first time, the phrase was added to the flag of the United States Marine Corps. "The Halls of Montezuma" refers to the Battle of Chapultepec on 12/13 September 1847 during the Mexican—American War, where a force of Marines stormed Chapultepec Castle. Strictly, the usage "Halls of Montezuma" is factually wrong, as the building which the Marines stormed had been erected by the Spanish rulers of Mexico, more than two centuries after the Aztec Emperor Montezuma was overthrown. Rather than the "Halls of Montezuma", the halls which the Marines entered were actually those of the Viceroys of New Spain. Attribution: Wikipedia

Nicknames for the flag of the United States of America include the **Stars and Stripes**, **Old Glory**, and the **Star-Spangled Banner**. On a field of blue in the top left-hand corner, there are 50,(5-pointed) stars comprised of 5 rows of 6 stars interlaced with 4 rows of 5 stars making a total of 50 stars corresponding to the 50 states. There are 7 red stripes interlaced with 6 white stripes corresponding to the Thirteen British Colonies who declared independence in 1776 and together formed the **United States of America**.
